What are the Benefits?

- The one hour stick game fits today's busy lifestyle
- Appropriate for curlers with physical limitations and disabilities
- Less sweeping – More focus on shot accuracy

What are the Differences?

In comparison to Traditional Curling

- Two player teams.
- Six end games - six rocks per end.
- Each player stays at one end for the entire game.
- Each player skips half the game.
- Sweeping and brushing is not allowed between hog lines.
- Players are not allowed to cross centre ice except when a timeout is called
- Four rock rule. Free guard zone.
