Provincial Championships:

2022 Stick Curling Provincial championship (Men's & Women's Divisions) was held at Wolfville CC March 17-20, 2022.

Clinics:

A funding proposal is before Sport NS. If successful NSSCA will offer two Train the Trainer sessions, six basic skills clinics and two advanced strategy / theory clinics.

Leagues:

The competitive league is growing again this year and has four tournaments planned for the year.

The inter-club leagues in Metro and Pictou County are expected to form again this year.

Hall of Fame:

Paul Doucet and Dave MacDougal were elected to the NSSCA Hall of Fame in the team category. Hubert Sullivan was elected in the builder category.

The Honours committee is re-examining the Hall of Fame nomination criteria and will bring recommendations to the Board.

The Honours committee will be soliciting nominations for 2023 inductees.

Other:

The NSSCA has committed to produce three webinars in conjunction with Curler Outreach (an organization based in the US) and the CSCA.

The NSSCA has drafted a kinesiology study proposal that has been submitted to a Nova Scotia university for consideration.

The NSSCA is working on a proposal in conjunction with Wheelchair Curling Nova Scotia and Parasport Nova Scotia around creating an accessibility library of the Nova Scotia curling clubs.
