Nova Scotia Stick Curling Hall of Fame Inductees

Up until now, our stick curling community has celebrated seven Hall of Fame inductees, all of whom have been men—trailblazers who have shaped our sport as builders, individual competitors, or as part of teams. This year marks an exciting milestone with the first-ever women's team (Diane Mallinson/Pauline Bullerwell) being recognized in the team category.

These women were true pioneers in our province, stepping onto the ice in 2012 to compete against the men, as there was no women's division at the time. When the first women's individual event was introduced in 2015, they not only competed but also claimed the title. Over the years, they have continued to set the bar high, earning an incredible 14 medals—6 gold and 8 silver.

Their dedication, skill, and perseverance have paved the way for future generations of women in stick curling. Their induction into the Hall of Fame is a well-earned recognition of their impact on the sport, and we couldn't be more proud. Check out our website to see the Bio's of all our inductees. Changes in the National Stick Curling Championship Format

The new format for the 2026 National Championship was announced at the National Championship on April 2, 2025 and will be tabled for approval on June 4, 2025.

Nova Scotia will have the first opportunity to showcase this new style of play at the National Championship. The event will be held **March 25 - 29, 2026.** Two clubs in our

province will co-host the event, the Wolfville Curling Club, and the Windsor Curling Club. More details on registration will follow, but consider this your heads up!

Starting in 2026, the Championship will feature two distinct events: the National Championship and the National Challenge.

- <u>The National Championship</u> will consist of three divisions (Men's, Women's, Mixed) with teams required to win their way into their respective division. Only provincial winners will advance to the National Championship. Additionally, the National Champions from the past two years will have a reserved spot in the competitive field. Since 2026 marks the first year for a Mixed National Championship division, the two reserved spots for past mixed champions will take a couple of years to be filled.
- <u>The National Challenge</u> will also feature the same three divisions as the National Championship event. This event welcomes teams from across the country without the need for prior qualifications anyone can apply to participate.

These changes aim to provide a more structured and inclusive competition, allowing both high-performance and recreational players to compete at a level that best suits their experience and goals.

Congratulations to all NS teams who competed in this year's Canadian Championship in Grande Prairie AB, April 2 - 6.. With four out of the five teams advancing to the playoff round, it was a tremendous showing for Team Nova Scotia and something to be proud of.

Among those four playoff teams, one advanced all the way to the Championship Game
 - Keith Bennett and Paul Landry. This marks back - to - back silver medals for them at the Canadian Championship. That's no small feat. Medaling at a National event of this calibre is a tremendous accomplishment, and one they should be very proud of. We congratulate them on their hard work and success. The Nova Scotia stick curling community is proud of you.


